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Assyrian Neo-Aramaic or simply Assyrian (ܐܘܪܝܝܢܐ or ܐܘܪܝܝܢܐ, Sʿreʿ), also known as Eastern Syriac, is a Neo-Aramaic language within the Semitic branch of the Afro-Asiatic language family that is largely spoken by Assyrian people.
